Fireworks Ordinance on Tribal Lands

Please remember as you celebrate this 4th of July, that while fireworks are fun and exciting, they can be a fire and safety hazard if not handled properly.

CIT Tribal Ordinance 650.620 states that a person commits a fireworks violation if the person sells or uses fireworks within the lands of the Tribe, except as hereby provided:

1. Only those fireworks allowed by the State of Oregon are approved for use on Tribal Lands.
2. Fireworks may only be ignited during the 48 hours before the official holiday and for 24 hours after.
3. Official holidays during which fireworks may be ignited are the 4th of July and New Years Day.
4. Any person under the age of eighteen must have the immediate supervision of an adult.
5. Improper or unsafe use will result in the confiscation of all fireworks in the possession of the person by Tribal Police.
6. Tribal officials may make subsequent restrictions on the use of fireworks based on public safety, weather conditions, and fire concerns.
7. In addition, and not in lieu of any other penalty allowed by law, a \$50 assessment shall be paid to the Coquille Indian Housing Authority by any person found in violation of this ordinance.

Second Hand Smoke:

A lethal Combination of Chemicals

Secondhand smoke contains 43 cancer-causing agents and many other toxins.

Acetone

One of the active ingredients in nail polish remover.

Ammonia

Helps the body absorb more nicotine, which keeps people hooked on smoking. Also used in cleaners and causes asthma and elevated blood pressure.

Arsenic

A deadly poison that makes the lips burn and breath smell bad.

Benzene

Causes leukemia and is found in pesticides and gasoline.

Benzopyrene

One of the most potent cancer-causing chemicals.

Butane

A highly flammable component of gasoline.

Cadmium

Found in batteries. Remains in the body for

years and damages the brain, liver, and kidneys.

Carbon Monoxide

A poisonous gas produced by burning fuel such as oil.

Formaldehyde

Embalming fluid. Causes cancer and can damage the lungs, skin, and digestive systems.

Hydrogen Cyanide

Used in the gas chamber and weakens the lungs.

Lead

Used in paint. Causes anemia and stomach problems. Damages the brain, nerves, kidneys, and the reproductive system.

Phenol

Used in disinfectants and weakens the lungs.

Propylene Glycol

Found in de-icer.

Toluene

Used in paint thinner and is highly toxic.

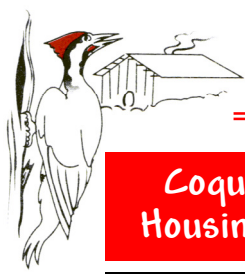
