Tsunami Evacuation Drill

On the afternoon of Thursday, May 31, 2012 at 2:00 p.m., Kilkich residents along with the Community Center staff and children, the Health Center staff and patients, the Housing office staff, and the Tribal Police took part in the scheduled Coos Bay Region Tsunami Evacuation

Drill. The communitywide drill was a planned event presented by the Oregon Department of Geology and Mineral Industries (DOGAMI) and organized by local Tsunami Outreach Oregon Coordinators and the Tribal emergency preparedness workgroup. The main purpose of the drill was to provide a real-time opportunity for people to experience how long it would take them to reach an assembly area, practice carrying their "grab and go" kit, and rehearse what to do in the event of a real emergency. There was a question and answer session immediately following the drill.

A number of people participated in the tsunami evacuation drill, including a patient in a wheelchair.





We look forward to having more people take part next year; the communitywide tsunami drill will be an annual event.

Great Summer Reads for Youth (and Adults) at the Library

The CIT Library recently received an order of books geared toward younger readers. Throughout the summer, some of these materials will be used for the After School Summer program. Of course, these and a whole bunch of other items are always available at the Library!

<u>Buffalo Dreams</u>: A young person's book about a family of a young girl who hears about the birth of a white buffalo calf and decides to travel to see it and deliver gifts.

Yes Day!: I'm sure only an innocent youth would ever think that a day when every answer is yes is a good thing. Read this to your children and see what happens!

<u>Sausages</u>: A young couple receives three wishes from a magic elf. One of them feels hungry and accidently

wishes for a whole bunch of the book's title.

Fahrenheit 451: OK, this is a sciencefiction classic that may not be the best for younger readers, but a teenager who is into classics might want to give it a try. Written in 1953 by Ray Bradbury, this book is considered a classic novel of censorship and defiance. Bradbury recently passed away at the age of 93.

The BFG: For video game players, this book by Raul Dahl refers to the Big Friendly Giant who is the main character and hero. Dahl is also the author of <u>Charlie and the Chocolate Factory</u> and <u>James and the Giant Peace</u>. Both of these books are also available at the Library.

When is a Planet Not a Planet? The Story of Pluto: So we only have eight planets in our solar system now? This is one of the science books the Library purchased that is aimed at younger readers. This one explains not only Pluto, but also how a planet

is defined and a brief history of astronomy.

Neo Leo: Reflecting on Leonardo Da Vinci, the famous painter, writer, engineer, and inventor of Europe's Renaissance, this book is not as much about the individual, but about his innovations and ideas that were used after Da Vinci's death by other inventors to create many things that people still use today; just mundane stuff like contact lenses, parachutes, and single-span bridges. The way the information is presented in this book could easily inspire a young reader to want to learn more.

What Makes the World Go 'Round?:

This is one of over 150 questions (and answers) about the natural world that you will find in this book. The questions are all very interesting to any reader. Examples of other questions with relatively simple answers include "Where did people first farm crops?" and "Why is the Earth round?"

Coffee Grounds ... Creative Ways to Reuse and Repurpose

A cup of coffee is a great way to start the day, and instead of throwing the coffee grounds in the trash, perhaps one of the following practical and creative ways to reuse and repurpose the used coffee grounds might interest you.

Spent coffee grounds can be used as:

Plant and Lawn Fertilizer Coffee grounds are a natural,
organic fertilizer containing
nitrogen, sulfur, phosphorous,
potassium, magnesium, and
calcium. Just sprinkle the coffee

grounds around the base of plants or directly onto your lawn.

- Pest Control Ants and other pests will not cross coffee grounds.
 Place a ring of coffee grounds near entry ways and windows to keep pests out.
- <u>Cat Control</u> Cats are repelled by the smell of coffee grounds.
 Lightly sprinkle coffee grounds around the yard and garden to stop cat damage.
- <u>Kitchen Deodorizer</u> Coffee grounds can be used in place of baking soda. Place a small, open

- container of wet coffee grounds in the back of the refrigerator or freezer until the grounds are dry.
- Hand Deodorizer After handling fish or chopping onions or garlic, rub coffee grounds between your hands to remove the strong odor. The grounds will exfoliate your skin while leaving a slight coffee fragrance.

Please remember as you celebrate this 4th of July, that while fireworks are fun and exciting, they can be a fire and safety hazard if not handled properly.

CIT Tribal Ordinance 650.620 states that a person commits a fireworks violation if the person sells or uses fireworks within the lands of the Tribe, except as hereby provided:

- Only those fireworks allowed by the State of Oregon are approved for use on Tribal Lands.
- 2. Fireworks may only be ignited during the 48 hours before the official holiday and for 24 hours after.
- Official holidays during which fireworks may be ignited are the 4th of July

and New Years Day.

- Any person under the age of eighteen must have the immediate supervision of an adult.
- 5. Improper or unsafe use will result in the confiscation of all fireworks in the possession of the person by Tribal Police.
- Tribal officials may make subsequent restrictions on the use of fireworks based on public safety, weather conditions, and fire concerns.
- 7. In addition, and not in lieu of any other penalty allowed by law, a \$50 assessment shall be paid to the Coquille Indian Housing Authority by any person found in violation of this ordinance.
