27th Annual Tribal Restoration Celebration June 24, 25, 26

June 28, 2016 will mark the
27th anniversary of the
Coquille Tribe's Restoration!
It was on June 28, 1989, that the
Coquille Indian Tribe re-gained
status as a federally recognized
Indian Tribe.

After 34 years of "termination" and federal policy that denied the Tribe's status as Indian people, Public Law 101-42 restored the Tribe's eligibility to participate in federal Indian programs and to receive federal funding for Tribal education, health, and law enforcement programs.

6th Annual Renter Front Yard Makeover Drawing

If you rent a single-family home in the Kilkich community and are NOT living in a unit that has had a front yard makeover in the past, you are eligible to enter the 6th Annual Renter Front Yard Makeover Drawing.

- There is no cost to enter the drawing.
- One entry per household.
- The winner will be chosen by random drawing at the June 16th CIHA Board meeting.
- The prize is valued at up to \$2 per square foot.
- To be eligible, the renter agrees to perform required maintenance upon new landscape installation in accordance with Section 6(K) of their Rental Lease Agreement.

The winner will take part in the design of



their new front yard with a focus on easy maintenance, a lowwater landscape, and the incor-

poration of indigenous plants and materials.



The winner will NOT:

- Be eligible to participate in the next two CIHA Landscaping Contests held each year in June.
- Be eligible to enter the Renter Front Yard Makeover Drawing again for the duration of their tenancy at their current address.

The winner will be notified by telephone or mail and announced in the July edition of the Sea~Ha Runner newsletter.

Books for Young Adults at CIT Library

The CIT Library has over 2,500 reasons for you to visit. This month's article includes some book reviews that might work as a summer reading project.

Seaman: The Dog who Explored the West with Lewis & Clark - Written by Gail Karwoski, copies of this history of the Corps of Discovery told through the eyes of their dog, Seaman, were gifted to Coquille students at a Mid-Winter Gathering around eight years ago. A few copies remain at the CIT Library.

Sacajawea - Famed
Native American
author Joseph
Bruchac wrote this
youth-oriented
biography of the
Shoshoni woman who
worked as a guide,
translator and

diplomat as she helped guide the Lewis & Clark expedition from the Mississippi River to the Pacific Ocean.

Native American Animal Stories -Joseph Bruchac also published a collection of 24 animal stories from the Mohawk, Hopi, Yagui, Haida, Miwoc and other tribes showcasing the power of animals in some Native American traditions. This is one of many printed versions of traditional stories kept at the Tribe's Library.

The Coquille
Indians: Yesterday,
Today, and
Tomorrow There are numerous
copies of this
Roberta Hall written
history on the Tribe.
Over thirty years
old, this work is still

relevant with the many biographies of Coquille people included in it. What young Tribal member would not want to spend a little time learning about their ancestors?

The Indians of Western Oregon: This Land Was Theirs - This book would make a good first read for a teenage reader who wants to learn about the Coos, Coquille, and other native peoples who lived on the southwest Oregon coast before and after the arrival of pioneers and settlers. Stephen Dow Beckham wrote this book after being contacted by members of the Coos Bay Indian Parent Committee in 1976.

The First Oregonians, 1st Edition - Experts, including representatives from each of Oregon's nine tribes, published this collection of 5-6 page essays describing each tribes' unique traditions, how each tribe was impacted by the Federal Government, and what these federally recognized tribes do today to thrive in modern America while not forgetting

CIHA's Annual Landscaping Contest in June

CIHA will hold its annual landscaping contest again this year. The criteria will be the same as it has been in past years.

Both homeowners and renters will be judged individually. Within the homeowner and renter categories, the front yard and back yard will be judged separately.

Yard judging is scheduled to take place the third week of June this year. The local Master Gardeners will once again be the judges for the landscaping contest.

The judges will stop at each home (unless you have notified CIHA that you do not want your yard judged), take notes, perhaps some digital photos, and then collaboratively compare, tally, and decide the landscaping winners.

There is no fee or sign-up sheet to enter the contest; your yard will automatically be judged unless you contact the CIHA office at 541-888-6501 by Monday, June 6th to let CIHA know that you do NOT want to participate in the landscaping contest.

You do not have to be a skilled gardener to be a winner in this contest; everyone is encouraged to participate.
