Daylight Saving Time Ends on Sunday, November 5

Daylight saving time (DST) will end on Sunday, November 5th at 2:00 a.m.



Daylight saving time will begin in 2018 on Sunday, March 11th at 2:00 a.m.

Fun Facts ~



1784: The idea of DST is first conceived by Benjamin Franklin.

1914 - 1918: Britain goes on DST during WWI.

March 19, 1918: The Standard Time Act establishes time zones and daylight saving. Daylight saving is repealed in 1919, but continues to be recognized in certain areas of the U.S.

1945 - 1966: There is no federal law regarding DST.

1966: The Uniform Time Act of 1966 establishes the system of uniform DST throughout the U.S. The dates are the last Sunday in April to the last Sunday in October. States can exempt themselves from participation.

1974 - 1975: Congress extends DST in order to save energy during the energy crisis.

1986 - 2006: DST begins on the first Sunday in April and ends on the last Sunday in October.

August 8, 2005: President George W. Bush signs the Energy Policy Act of 2005 into law. DST, starting in 2007, begins the 2nd Sunday in March and ends the 1st Sunday in November.

2007: All of Indiana now observes DST, only certain areas of the state did before.

In the U.S., Hawaii and most of Arizona do not follow DST. U.S. Territories of Guam, Puerto Rico, Virgin Islands, and American Samoa do not observe DST.

Many countries near the equator do not adjust their clocks for DST.

Neither China or Japan observe DST.

About 70 countries around the world observe DST.

Common Scheme Restrictions for Members of the Kilkich Community

The purpose of the Kilkich community Common Scheme Restrictions is to enhance the use, safety, sanitation, and beauty of the Kilkich community. Below is a reminder of two of the common scheme restrictions to be aware of. For a complete list of the Kilkich Common Scheme Restrictions, please contact the CIHA office at 541-888-6501.

- ◆ All parking, other than in the driveway or garage, must be on the side of the street where the streetlights are and must not exceed 24 hours.
- ◆ No tent structure, camper, recreational vehicle, motorcycle, trail bike, snowmobile, boat, trailer, motor coach or mobile home, or any structure of any kind shall be parked, placed, erected, or used upon the property. Certain structures may be placed upon the property with the permission of CIHA.

HOW TO EARN THE MAXIMUM HOLIDAY CREDIT

The CIHA Board of Commissioners have approved a 2017 December holiday credit to be awarded to each household on Tribal Lands. The credit ranges from \$25 to \$150 and will appear on your December billing statement.

If you are interested in earning the maximum holiday credit in 2018, the criteria are as follows:

1. Pay your rent/house payment on time and in full each month.
2. Pass your annual household inspection.
3. Return all paperwork in full and on time.
4. Have no actionable neighborhood complaints.
5. Have no power, water, or garbage shutoff notices.
6. Have no yard notices.

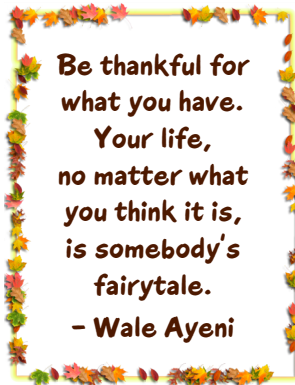

- Valid photo ID
- Proof of address IF different from photo ID
- Proof of ALL persons residing permanently in the household
- Income verification for entire household (if you receive SNAP, a printout from the DHS office works great for verification)

NOTE: If you sign up to receive a Christmas Food Basket (Knights of Columbus) or Christmas Toys with any other organization, you will NOT qualify for Christmas assistance through The Salvation Army office.

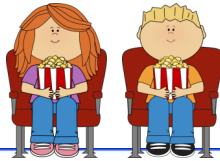
