Re: ***Action on NAHASDA Reauthorization Bill in the House***

This morning we learned that the NAHASDA Reauthorization bill introduced by Representative Steve Pearce (R-NM), HR 3864, will be subject to mark up at a House Financial Services Committee meeting to be held next **Tuesday, December 12, 2017** (along with a number of other bills). The hearing begins at 10:00 AM. This is a promising sign of momentum on this bill.

However, we have also heard (but have not been able as yet to independently verify) about some other potential developments with the HR 3864. We have heard that the Financial Services Committee Chairman Jeb Hensarling (R-TX) is requiring that the Native Hawaiian provisions be dropped from the bill for it to move out of Committee. We also heard that Representative Pearce wants the bill to move forward, so he will be agreeing to accept the Chairman's requirement and will remove the Native Hawaiian provisions from the bill.

We have also heard (but, again, have not been able yet to confirm) that Representative Gwen Moore (D-WI), a co-sponsor of HR 3864, is expected to offer an amendment during markup to put those provisions back in. In order for that effort to succeed, she will need to get strong support from other members of the Committee – both Republican and Democratic. Therefore, if these provisions are important to you (and we understand the bill may not get Democratic support without such provisions) it will be crucial to reach out to other members of the Financial Services Committee, particularly those members who are in your District.
