AUTO REPAIR POLICY

PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to clarify what automobile repairs and maintenance may be done within the Fourth Creek Community. Automobile includes any self-propelled vehicle or trailer that may be towed.

Only minor repairs may be done. Minor is defined as being operations that can, and are, completed in one 24-hour period, and are further described in Section H of the Lease. Minor repairs may be done on the owner/operator's licensed vehicle only and does not include any business repair, whether paid or not. Race cars are not included in owner/operator vehicles. Any vehicles must be operable, meaning vehicles may not be towed into the property, except for trailers.

These minor repairs are listed on the attached schedule.

In the event of uncertainty about any forbidden or permitted activities, contact the Executive Director for a definition. The Executive Director's decision is final.

SCHEDULE OF REPAIRS

MINOR REPAIRS - ALLOWED

Replacing bumpers and trim

Dabbing of chips of paint

Washing, waxing or detailing

Changing windshield wipers

Changing oil

Adding fluids (oil, washer fluid, brake fluid, transmission fluid, air)

Changing or rotating tires or wheels

Installing radios and accessories, or replacing radio antennae

Changing shocks

Replacing spark plugs, engine belts or engine hoses

Replacing or repairing water pumps, fuel pumps or alternators

Replacing or repairing carburetor, fuel injection system, or starter

Replacing or repairing exhaust system or parts thereof

Replacing batteries or lights

Repairing brakes

MAJOR REPAIRS - NOT ALLOWED

Welding or grinding body

Body repairs or bondo

Priming or painting body

Changing windshield or other glass

Replacing or installing upholstery

Replacing engine

Replacing timing belts

Replacing transmission, drive lines, or differential

GENERAL ACTIVITES THAT ARE FORBIDDEN

Any activity that allows fluids to drip on ground surface

Any activity that allows parts, materials and supplies to be left in the open

Any activity that takes more than 24 hours from start to finish

Any activity that is not on the residents' own private licensed vehicle

Any activity that is on a vehicle that must be towed to the property

Any activity that requires lifting must have an adult in attendance at all times

Anything that is not listed is not okay. If you have any question about anything you intend to do, ask the Executive Director for an interpretation.
