September is National Preparedness Month

The 2019 National Preparedness Month theme is "Prepared, Not Scared."

As the theme implies, be 'prepared' for any unseen disaster, not 'scared'. If the thought of an impending disaster has you worried or the thought of being inadequately prepared has you feeling anxious, prepare NOW. It is as easy as following a list and putting together your supplies.

Emergencies can happen anywhere at anytime.

Prepare and PRACTICE what you will do in any emergency. Build on and update your plan, at the on the internet that demonvery least, on an annual basis.

Discuss the various disasters that could affect your family with your family, e.g., fire, earthquake, tsunami, power outage, terrorist attack, etc. Make a plan with your family on what to do in each emergency. Begin by packing a "Go Bag" for every family member. Your "Go Bag" should be with you wherever you are (home, work, vacation, etc.). If you don't know where to start, log on to:
