Salmon Ceremony: 9:00 a.m. - Bullard's Beach West Day Use

The Salmon Ceremony is an annual event to honor the salmon. The bones of the first salmon are returned to the river on an out-going tide, so that the fish will tell the others that we are grateful, honorable people.

For those that wish to participate from their home, we will be livestreaming the ceremony to the Restoration event on the K'wen Facebook page. Please keep in mind phone service may be limited. If the live feed is not coming through, we will be sure to post a recording of the ceremony to the event page.

Welcome, Invocation and Presentation of the Flags: 12:00 p.m.

Tribal members can view the welcoming by Chairperson Brenda Meade, Presentation of the Flags and Invocation by Chief Don Ivy through the livestream that will be posted in the Restoration event on the K'wen Facebook page.

Salmon Bake: 12:30 p.m.

Cooking salmon in the pit has been part of Coquille tradition for years. While we may not be able to gather around the fire pit, we would still like to share salmon together.

If you would like to pick up frozen salmon for your household, or have canned salmon mailed to your family, please be sure to RSVP to Jennifer ViksneHill at ienniferviksnehill@coquilletribe.org no later than Wednesday, June 17, 2020!

Please note, we have a limited amount of salmon filets that will be distributed to elders. All other salmon will need to be thawed, cleaned and prepared before cooking.

If you prefer to pick-up a whole frozen salmon, please contact Jennifer ViksneHill to make arrangements.

For those that live outside of Oregon or are unable to meet at one of the locations listed above, we would be happy to mail canned salmon to your family.

Please remember to RSVP! In order to save costs, we will only be mailing canned salmon to those who have requested it, as well as traveling with a limited number of salmon.

What is Zoom?

Zoom is a meeting platform that integrates video and phone conferencing.

Zoom can accommodate almost any type of technology, from land lines to iPads.

There are two options for accessing a Zoom meeting:

- 1. Internet link
- 2. Phone line

First thing's first;

What kind of device will you be using?

Computer? Please skip to Computer section.

Smart phone or tablet? *Please skip to Smart Phone or Tablet section.*

Land line telephone or simply calling in using your cell phone? Please keep reading.

Calling in From a Land Line or Cell Phone

- 1. Call the Zoom conference line number.
 - a. There will be several number options to choose from. Choose the geographical option that is closest to your location. There are typically a couple of west coast options and one or two east coast options.
- 2. Follow the prompts to enter the correct meeting.
- 3. Congrats! You've successfully logged in and are ready to participate.

Smart Phone or Tablet

- 1. Click on the meeting link in your email. The link should prompt you to download the Zoom application to your device, or if you already have the app, it will skip to the next step.
- Once the Zoom app has been downloaded and installed, you will be directed to the meeting.
- 3. Congrats! You've successfully logged in and are ready to participate.

Computer

- 1. Click on the meeting link in your email. The link should prompt you to download the Zoom application to your device, or if you already have the app, it will skip to the next step.
- 2. Once the Zoom app has been downloaded and installed, you will be directed to the meeting.
- 3. Congrats! You've successfully logged in and are ready to participate.

Final Considerations

If you are using a computer with a camera, but no microphone, you can *also* call in from a land line to get audio.

Mute yourself when joining a meeting. Ambient noise or too many people talking can quickly overwhelm a meeting.

If you would like to speak, please "raise your hand". There is a raise your hand option in the application that will alert the meeting owner that you would like to speak.

If you are having internet or computer issues, don't hesitate to leave the meeting and dial in from a land line or cell phone. Better to call in with audio only than try to navigate a frustrating bandwidth experience.
