Fourth Creek Reservoir Security Fencing

Installation of fence along Cape Arago Highway to help protect the 4th Creek salmon hatchery program will tentatively begin at the end of July. An approximately 1,128-foot long, 6-foot tall chain-link fence with black vinyl coating will run from just north of the Miluk Drive entry up to Tarheel Lane. Construction of this fence will be done by West Coast Fencing Company and should be completed in one to two weeks.

The construction of this fence is funded through a Bureau of Indian Affairs grant under the Hatchery Maintenance Funding program. The purpose of installing this fence is to deter trespass, theft, and vandalism at the 4th Creek acclimation pond and adult salmon trapping facility.
