**DUMPSTERS ARRIVING ON TRIBAL LANDS ON FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 13<sup>TH</sup>**  
**DUMPSTERS ARE FOR THE USE OF KILKICH RESIDENTS ONLY**  
**PLEASE FOLLOW THE GUIDELINES LISTED BELOW**  
**DUMPSTERS LEAVING TRIBAL LANDS ON MONDAY, NOVEMBER 23<sup>RD</sup>**



**Community dumpsters may no longer be provided in the future due to the ongoing and increasing abuse of the dumpsters.**

Some of the dumpster issues have been: people who do not live on Tribal Lands using the dumpsters; people who do live on Tribal Lands using the dumpsters for friends and family who do not live on Tribal Lands; items NOT allowed in the dumpsters have been thrown in; the dumpsters have been repeatedly overloaded, to the point that the garbage overflows onto the ground; and people have climbed up and into the dumpsters taking out discarded items.

**This may be the last time dumpsters will be on Tribal Lands if these problems continue.**



The Kilkich Residents Association (KRA) has offered to help monitor the dumpsters this year. As a Kilkich community member, please do your part by using the dumpsters per the guidelines and if you see someone throwing items in the dumpster that are not allowed, say something.

**If you are unsure if an item can be discarded in the dumpster, contact CIHA at (541) 888-6501.**

DO NOT overfill the dumpster. If the dumpster is full, please wait to dispose of your items until a new dumpster arrives. The dumpsters will leave on Monday, November 23<sup>rd</sup> so it is a good idea not to wait until the last day to use the dumpster as it may be full.

Items NOT allowed in the dumpsters include, but are not limited to:

- antifreeze
- appliances
- batteries
- digital devices
- electronics
- hazardous waste
- motor oil
- paint
- solvents
- tires



Please recycle your household items whenever possible.

Appliances are recyclable and are accepted at West Coast Recycling in Coos Bay free of charge.

Recycle your computers, monitors, TVs, printers, keyboards, and mice at an Oregon E-Cycles location. Oregon E-Cycles is a FREE,

easy, and environmentally responsible program.

## Household Hazardous Waste Collection Events

How to bring your household hazardous waste products to the event:

Products should be left in their original container. Label materials not in their original container only if you are sure of their content.

Do not mix products together. Dangerous reactions can occur when some materials are mixed.

Make sure containers are properly sealed so they won't leak or spill. If a container is leaking, secure it in a secondary leak proof container.

Transport in a sturdy box or tub in your trunk or truck bed.

Please do not put items in plastic bags or garbage cans.

## Metal Collection Event

Coos County has extended the time period for the metal collection event at the Beaver Hill Disposal Site. The time period has been extended to **September 30, 2021**. The fee for metal will be waived for this time period.

Examples of accepted items:

- ◆ washers, dryers, stoves, water heaters, small metal appliances
- ◆ wood burning stoves
- ◆ empty burn barrels
- ◆ barbeques
- ◆ microwave ovens
- ◆ refrigerators/freezers – Coos County will remove freon and compressors
- ◆ small and large metal tools
- ◆ metal furniture
- ◆ bicycles
- ◆ exercise equipment (metal)
- ◆ tire rims
- ◆ lawn equipment (drained)
- ◆ empty propane tanks with valve/stem removed
- ◆ metal fencing with wood posts removed
- ◆ nails, screws, misc. (please place in metal container or tin cans)
- ◆ miscellaneous scrap metal

*Not accepted: vehicles, logging and fishing cable, Household Hazardous Waste*

**If you have any questions, please call 541-396-7620. Please leave a short message and a phone number as booth attendant may be outside the booth with customers.**

If you have household garbage, furniture, brush, tires, or construction debris that you are bringing to Beaver Hill, please remember those items will need to be separated. The fees for these items will not be waived during the metal collection event.
