- The Community Gathering Room and family services area will get overhead sprinklers.

Furniture arrived this week for the Ko-Kwel Wellness Center pharmacy, and the excited staff took a tour.

"It's the most beautiful pharmacy I've ever seen," said pharmacist Caryn Mickelson. "Everything is new and efficient and well-thought-out."

The pharmacy will be the first section of the wellness center to open. Other sections are moving along rapidly.

#### This week

- Workers are hanging interior doors.
- The family services area is being prepped for flooring.
- The fire sprinkler system passed its inspection.
- Ceiling tile is being installed in the medical clinic.

#### **Coming soon**

- Cabinets will be installed in the dental clinic, the family services area, and the mail and copy room.
- Exam tables and other medical equipment should arrive Feb. 17.
- Furniture will start moving into the medical clinic Feb. 18.

# Moving toward a move-in

Progress at the Ko-Kwel Wellness Center is steady and methodical, as construction crews complete more and more of the project's countless details.

#### **Recent progress**

- Smoke alarms and sprinklers are functional in Zone 1 (medical and pharmacy).
- Furniture is moving into the pharmacy, which is just about ready to open. (A state certificate is the main holdup.)
- Interior doors and corner guards are being installed.
- After a thorough cleanup and minor touchups this week, the medical area should be essentially finished.
- The rollup door for the shipping and receiving area was installed today.

#### **Coming soon**

- Furniture for the medical clinic
- Pavement under the covered drive-up.
- Cabinets, countertops and windowsills for the dental clinic and family services area.
