Dog running loose? Contact Tribal Police at (541) 269-8911. Tribal Police will issue a citation, if appropriate, or contact Animal Control.

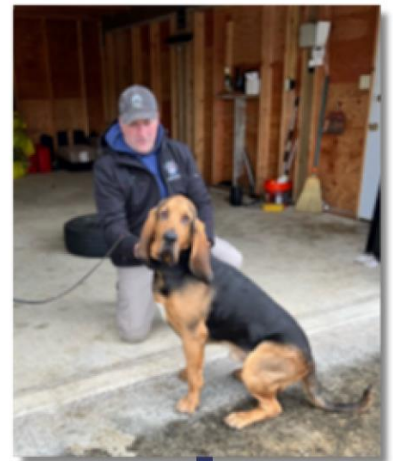
If you are a renter or a HomeGO participant, please remember that you are ONLY allowed to have Assistance Animals. Pets are NOT allowed in rental or home buying units.

All Assistance Animals must be documented (vaccinated, licensed, spayed or neutered, and a photo of the animal) with CIHA. Failure to do so is considered a program violation. Please call Tracey at CIHA for additional information.

## TRACK & SNIFF

Last month, the Coos Bay Police Department hosted the Oregon Police Canine Association's 2023 Spring Seminar. Approximately 140 patrol (tracking) and detection (narcotic) canine teams attended from around the state of Oregon. Participants received training on new techniques and laws from 20 state trainers and guest instructors. CBPD Officer Smith attended with patrol K9 Mika, Officer Scoville attended with detection K9 Ben, and Officer Martin attended as a training decoy.

Training and scenarios for the OPCA Spring Seminar were held over several windy and rainy days at different locations in Coos Bay including the CIHA warehouse. Patrol K9 teams focused on scenarios based on a previous Washington County Sheriff's Office case involving a K9 track and high-risk arrest. During training scenarios, patrol K9 teams trained on a variety of skills including K9 handler responsibilities during a track, suspect de-escalation, and building searches. Detection K9 teams practiced locating different narcotics and detecting odors in a variety of training environments through 16 different scenarios. K9 handlers also learned about specific aspects of working with their detection K9 and attended a four-hour session on case law and K9 deployment taught by a leading expert with the Oregon State Police K9 detection team.

# What is KRA?

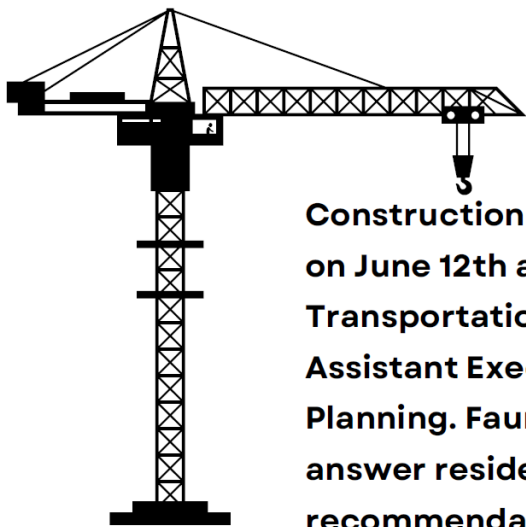
## THE KILKICH RESIDENTS ASSOCIATION
