19%

of AIAN have served in the armed forces vs 14% of all other ethnicities since 9/11

AIAN women make up

of the AIAN Veteran population.

**20**%

of AIAN service members were women, while 15.6% of all other service members were women.

10,000 served during the Korean War, many also fought World War II, 42,000+ served during the Vietnam War, 90% being volunteer enlisters.

AIANs have served in the U.S. Armed Forces at a rate 5Xs the national average.

Choctaw soldiers were the first to use their

NATIVE LANGUAGE to confuse the enemy,
making a difference in the outcome of World War I.

420

Amongst certain tribal nations, 70% of the men in a single nation have volunteered to join the military.

The U.S. Marine Corps, which operated the largest Code Talking Program, sent approximately 420 Diné (Navajo) language speakers to help win the war in the Pacific.
