

Survey Results

Over the past few months, we have conducted extensive data collection through key informant interviews, steering committee meetings, and from the tribal community survey. More than 300 Tribal members responded to the survey, thank you so much for your participation!

The primary objective was to understand Tribal members' key wants, needs, and concerns and to gather feedback on Members' vision for the Tribe's future. The DRAFT landscape analysis included in this packet synthesizes these findings to help our community develop shared aspirations for our Tribal nation in 2039.
