# PUBLIC SAFETY BULLETIN

## TRIBAL POLICE CHIEF GIVES PRAISE TO PUBLIC SAFETY TEAM IN TSUNAMI EMERGENCY

Without direction each individual team member responded immediately as if it were a perfect prepared emergency drill. The department door opened and team members scattered. Responses were made to each individual building to confirm evacuation was in progress. As team members passed each other it was communicated which building was next. Our police radios were useless as the county dispatch was in chaos. Communication was officer to officer, which worked very effectively. Minutes later it was communicated that all buildings were clear and evacuated. A perimeter was set up to ensure that residents were moving in the correct direction and moving to safety. The team was able to direct traffic coming onto the tribal property to safety. The team double and triple checked areas of concern, and were stationed to answer questions while directing everyone to higher ground.



Many thanks were given to our team members for their quick response.

As always we are constantly working and seeking better ways to provide service to our community and staff.

I would like to thank our team for their service and quick response to this incident.

Tsunamis that strike the Oregon Coast are caused by earthquakes or landslides. These earthquakes and landslides might occur far away (distant tsunami) or near where you live (local tsunami).

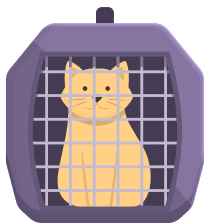
- A tsunami consists of a series of waves. Often the first wave may not be the largest. The danger from a tsunami can last for several hours after the arrival of the first wave.
- Tsunamis move faster than a person can run.
- Anyone who lives near the ocean or a large body of water is at risk of a tsunami.

## IF THERE IS A TSUNAMI WARNING OR EARTHQUAKE

- If you are at Kilkich, go to the designated evacuation site at the Plankhouse
- Follow directions of Tribal Police
- Do NOT try leaving the reservation.
- Take only the necessities
- with you.

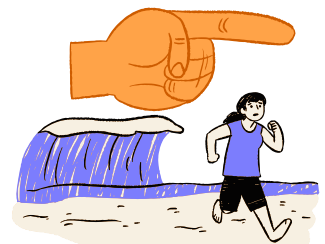
### SIGN UP FOR NIXLE AND RECEIVE IMPORTANT ALERTS

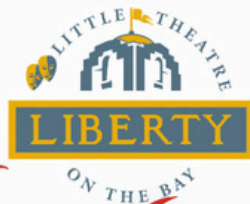

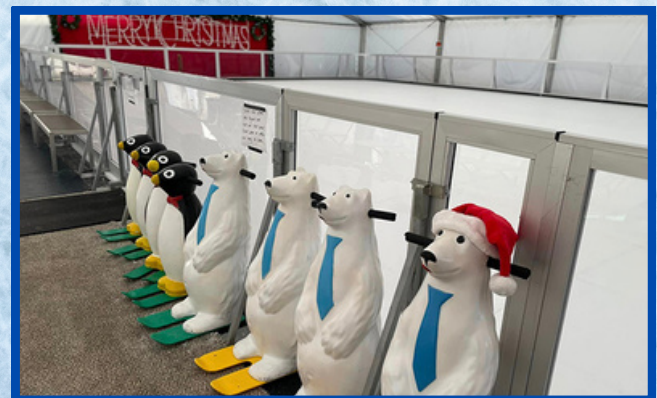
